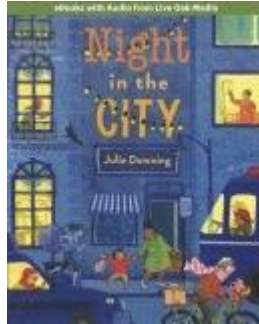


Night in the City Career People by Julie Downing
