November 2024 Admin Report To PAC

The new term started on November 12th, and report cards should be posted tomorrow to student and parent portals. Teachers should be making contact with parents of students they are concerned about this week. End of term was a busy time, with a Flex Day, grade 12 students writing their grade 12 Literacy assessment (linked to their English 12 class), fall sports teams having their Island and provincial tournaments, and Remembrance Day.

Athletics – The Fall Season is wrapping up!

The fall athletics season at Vanier was active and successful, with over 150 athletes participating across various sports. Our cross-country team had a fantastic season, with more than 25 athletes competing at the Island Championships in Powell River, and one individual advancing to the provincial championships on the Lower Mainland. Volleyball was equally impressive, with six teams showcasing their skills.

The Grade 8 teams had strong participation, and our girls performed exceptionally well, making a strong showing at the North Island tournament as they worked toward a BC qualification but ultimately fell just short. Our junior teams competed and worked hard, with the junior girls placing 4th at North Islands. At the senior level, both teams qualified for Islands, and our senior girls won the AAAA North Island title for the first time in a decade.

The energy and commitment of our athletes filled the gym from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily, making this fall season both successful and enjoyable while providing countless opportunities for our students to grow and excel.

Citizenship – Citizenship activities and giving back is something that has been embraced at Vanier. The Baking 12 class is baking 2500+ cookies for EDAS (Everyone Deserves A Smile) gift packages. Many schools within the valley help out with the packages, gathering up donations of socks, gloves, hats, scarves and small personal hygiene items. A winter accessory drive (scarves/hats/gloves) will begin very soon. The Sports Leadership class put together a haunted house experience for the school in our multipurpose room on Halloween, and student leadership/student government put on a fantastic costume parade in our gym. Our Leadership 9-12 class put on a phenomenal Remembrance Day service to the entire school. The Christmas Hamper Drive will be beginning in December, as Vanier continues to support our community.

Arts – Grade 8's and the Beginning Band 10 class gave a great concert, showcasing all that they have learnt so far this year. Junior and Senior band classes performed today at the Comox Valley Concert Band Festival. Dance classes and Drama/Acting 10-12 are preparing for their festival. Students in term classes of metalwork and woodwork should have brought their finished projects home at the end of term 1.

Grad 2025 –Winterfest (Dec 4th) is coming together well - many local businesses have donated prizes, and many parents have signed up to run gaming tables or help out at the Grad & Parent fun event. We are sticking to past practices to host a casino night theme with chances to win donated prizes -

more tickets from more games played and a wheel of Wow that should see each grad go home with a small donated gift /prize. We also have the fan favourite photo booths back. We will run a 50/50 for parents to participate in (thank you for doing up the license \bigcirc) to see if we can recover some of the rental fees.

School Photos - Photo question from last PAC meeting - Many parents have responded that this year, Lifetouch was not as smooth as previous years. Upon your request, we have information from Island Life Photography in Campbell River to review. Good news - they have samples for review through the lens of the parent portal and pricing was also shared. Challenges to consider, we are new to their list if we choose them, so we will not get priority booking times as we have for many years through Lifetouch. This company serves Campbell River and the Comox Valley so we need to consider whether they can handle us with their 19 schools already, incl 5 Middle or Sec schools + Isfeld, Highland & maybe us added to the mix). Presentation on Critical Incidents from Assc. Superintendent Sean Lamoureux and District Vice-Principal Tara Ryan. Critical Incidents are anything that disrupts the normal operations of a school day, but their Critical Incident Response Team CIRT is specifically for the terrible

scenario involving serious harm to staff and/or students. The Team is made up of very experienced staff, registered clinical counsellors and external (qualified & relevant) resources. They will do everything they can to support the school community through traumatic events. Brief discussion of Safer Schools Critical Incidents:

Lockdown = Threat/disruption inside the school (emphasis on safety and keeping students separated from harm.)

Hold & Secure = threat/disruption outside the school (proactive and goal is that student activity remains normal inside the school.)

• District will not seek to re-open **Tribune Bay Outdoor Education Center**: "Over the years, the infrastructure at Tribune Bay has unfortunately deteriorated, with significant upgrades now required to meet today's standards for safety, accessibility, and sustainability. This reality, coupled with the Tribune Bay Outdoor Education Society's inability to continue operating the Centre and the decision by the Qualicum School District not to renew its permit with BC Parks, has led us to re-evaluate our role in operating the centre. Ultimately, we concluded that the extensive resources needed to re-open the centre are beyond the district's capacity at this time."
