BURSARIES / SCHOLARSHIPS

- **BC School Sports has released this year's scholarship application booklet.** BCSS is offering several scholarships for the 2024-2025 school year to recognize excellence in athletics, leadership, and community service. - * The Registered Nurses Foundation of B.C. (RNFBC) bursaries are available to students who are entering college or university for nursing education in 2025.

RNFBC has been providing financial assistance to nurses and nursing students for 46 years in our province. In 2024 we were able to disperse 886 bursaries thanks in part to our generous donors and a substantial grant from the Ministry of Health. The majority of the bursaries were for \$1,000.00 each.

For the purposes of the bursary application process, "nurse" is defined as:

- Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN)
- Nurse Practitioners (NP)
- Registered Nurses (RN)
- Registered Psychiatric Nurses (RPN)

The bursary cycle for 2025 will commence on June 16 and run to September 15 and recipients are drawn at random once they meet the criteria. https://www.rnfbc.ca/bursaries-how-to-apply/
