<u>Guest Presentation – Megan Watson (FamilySmart):</u> Is a non-profit to give caregiver support. Megan has all lived experience - 8 children, melded family, dealing with anxiety, suicide, cancer, drug addiction.

- FamilySmart offers support, advocacy coaching, "a blanket not a cape" approach, help to navigate community services, help finding resources. They are a small group here but have access to a larger team on the mainland.
- Help for the Hard Times FREE Monthly topics are covered online & in person, June is about Self Harm
- Parents/caregivers can reach out directly or of a family/friend refers a person then FamilySmart can make 1st contact.
- Email is the quickest way right now to get a response

Trustee Report (Susan Leslie)

- SD71 is healthy & growing, currently we have a \$1 million deficit

Treasurer Report (Spring)

- As of May 1st, 2024:
 - o Gaming account \$19345.73

- o General account \$1,053.49
- Funding Reimbursement Claim #1 was received for a total of \$14 189.23. Spring Halasz motioned to pay the school this amount, it was seconded by Jen Vaino. All in favour, motion passed. A check with 2 signatures will be needed.
- The gaming license application fees fort Germany, Band & the Grad 50/50 need to be reimbursed to Spring from the gaming account, then the school can reimburse the PAC. For a total of \$85.
