#### Just a caution,

Funding is delivered at a district level and distributed down through schools. Funding does not "follow the student" as some parents may understand. All districts distribute this funding to schools in an equitable way as possible.

Secondly, If a student has learning needs that do not fall into these 'funding' categories schools still provide and are required to provide appropriate adaptations and supports for each student who needs it.
