Consent Week (September 16th to 20th)

Consent Week is recognized by all schools across our province and is set this year for September 16-20. Schools approach consent as something that is important to know about and practice every day. It can be defined as an agreement to engage in an activity and occurs when you ask, or give, permission to do something. Consent is used and should be used within daily life interactions and/or activities – in elementary school, this might look like asking someone's permission to borrow their school supplies, asking if someone wants a hug before hugging them, checking on personal space boundaries ("Can I sit beside you?") and keeping hands to self. The scope of what is taught depends on the age of the students. Teachers at Miracle Beach naturally and organically incorporate this learning into regular classroom teaching, as it is important to practice as part of daily life with others.

District Cell Phone Policy

As Comox Valley Schools continues to embrace the use of technology to support learning, we recognize the importance of maintaining a focused and safe learning environment for our students. This consideration has been recently reinforced by provincial guidelines and legislation. With this in mind, we would like to share some updates regarding the use of personal digital devices (PDDs) such as cell phones, tablets, smartwatches, earbuds, and other electronic gadgets within our schools.

At all elementary schools, there is **no student access to or use of personal digital devices at any time on the school campus during the school day**, unless they have been given permission by their school principal. This is essentially a "bell-to-bell" restriction from the beginning of school to the end of the day. Parents are reminded that elementary students are always under direct supervision and that the school will communicate with home for any emergent need that arises.

Terry Fox / Tour de Rock Cancer Fundraising

This Year our Terry Fox Run will be held on Monday September 16th. As well we will be welcoming the riders of Tour de Rock on September 25th.

During the weeks leading up to September 25th we will be raising money as a school that will help support cancer research. Self-Identification of Indigenous Ancestry (First Nations, Métis, or Inuit)

Indigenous Education Services in School District #71 (Comox Valley) offers various supports and opportunities to over 1,750 students of Indigenous Ancestry. Our goal is to enrich the educational opportunities for all our Indigenous students. The focus for our service is to enhance all Indigenous students' understanding of their heritage, their sense of belonging and the personal belief that they can be successful in the British Columbia public school system.

Indigenous Ancestry is determined on a voluntary basis through verbal self-identification. This includes First Nations (Status or Non-Status), Métis or Inuit Ancestry. We do not require further documentation. Ancestry may go back several generations and a Status Card is not required.

School Code of Conduct

Our <u>Miracle Beach Code of Conduct</u> sets clear expectations for behavior, fostering a safe and respectful environment. It promotes consistency, accountability, and helps prevent conflicts, ensuring that all students can focus on learning and personal growth. I have included it as an attachment on this email, and it is also available on our website.

Recess and Lunch

Students will be outside at recess and lunch unless the weather is really bad outside. Please ensure students have weather appropriate clothing with them at school. Also, Miracle Beach is in a beautiful rural area of the Comox Valley. As a result, we have the occasional visitor from nature. All classes will review best practice for bear and cougar safety. As part of our animal awareness students do not take food outside during recess and lunch. By not allowing garbage to be on the playground and field it will help reduce visits from bears and cougars.

Parking/ Drop-off

Please be aware our parking lot is not large. Families who drop off their student(s) should use our drop and go lane in the front of the school. Please note there is no parking for drop off as we are limited for space. Also, please be mindful to stay out of the bus lane. Our busses drop off/ pick up the large majority of our students and it is important for them to not be obstructed by other vehicles.

School Supplies

For the 2024-25 school year Miracle Beach will be providing basic school supplies to students in kindergarten to grade 7. Instead of parents purchasing individual sets of supplies, families provide money to the school and the school will purchase supplies for each student. This approach will ensure equity and equality among all students and will save parents time (no shopping!) and money (ordering in bulk, our discount on school supplies is significant). The only items parents will have to provide are a backpack, a lunch bag, and appropriate shoes for gym.

Kindergarten to grade 7 the fee will be \$40

The office will accept cash, cheque, or e-transfer

School Bus


In continued partnership with our transportation provider, First Student, Comox Valley Schools, SD71, is offering First View/Parent View, a bus tracking and parent communications app for your smartphone or desktop.

- For more information and to download the app, please go to <u>www.firstviewapp.com</u>.
- For FirstView app troubleshooting questions, please reach out directly to via email: support@firstviewapp.com or toll-free phone number 888-889-8920.
- To create an account, you will need your student's pupil ID, along with a special code:
- The code will be provided from the district once your student is a confirmed registered regular rider with the bus company.
- The district will be sending out codes once received from the bus company.

Rules for Riding the Bus

- Be at the bus stop 5 minutes ahead of the posted schedule. The bus will not wait for those who are late
- Stay on the shoulder or sidewalk, well away from the pavement, while waiting for the bus
- Do not run beside the bus while it is moving
- Boarding the bus will be in single file
- No saving spots in line or seats on the bus
- Take your seat right away
- The bus driver is always in charge
- Remain seated while the bus is in motion
- No eating on the school bus
- No fighting, bullying or horseplay on the bus
- Do not throw litter out the window of the bus
- Always keep head and arms in the bus
- Students are not able to ride a bus other than their assigned bus (e.g., for playdates etc.)
