### What is Dual Credit?

- Dual Credit means taking a college course while still in high school and receiving college course credits and high school elective course credits at the same time.
- This opportunity is for Grade 11 and 12 students, who meet the prerequisites.

### Why choose dual credit?

- 1. FREE tuition (some books in Library) you pay app fee (\$40)
- 2. It gives you a job that can make you a bigger paycheque.
- 3. It allows you to see what post-secondary school is like.
- 4. 80% of people return within 5 years to continue in their program of choice.
- 5. It's doable! Comparable to Eng. 12 and Hum & Phys 12

- <u>High school students</u> can take their first level of technical training at a college and have their <u>tuition</u> sponsored.
   (Books, material/lab fees, college fees are paid by the student)
- Students get Grade 12 credit for high school courses towards graduation <u>AND</u> an industry training level 1 - foundation program
- Full time <u>foundations</u> college programs (Mon Fri) that range from 5 months to 10 months long (start in September or February)
   (Each month is 4 grade 12 credits 1 class)
- Learning in an Adult environment (70% is the new 50%)



- Completing all 4 courses (WRK11A, WRK11B, WRK12A, WRK12B) that are 120hrs of work each and continuing to 900hrs makes you eligible to apply for a \$1000 scholarship.

- Semester 2 Program (One day a week Work Experience)
- 20 Course Credits (Trade Sampler 12A, 12B, 12C, Workplace Math 11 and Work Experience 12A)
- Students receive these certifications at minimum
  - WHMIS, First Aid—Level 1, Forklift, plus...
  - Match college/industry
- Industry/College tours
- Have a district application and an interview process in the spring
- 16 kids in a class

# \*\* New\*\*District Sampler Program Tourism and Event Management

- Students will learn the industry of tourism and event management, including hospitality, eco-tourism, Indigenous tourism, local attractions and marketing.
- Students will work on micro-credentials, industry certifications, hands on experience, and take part in field trips that provide networking opportunities.

- Students will work on industry certifications, take part in three hands on work placements, and attend field trips that provide insights into the health field and the variety of career opportunities.










### Careers Office Work Experience 12A & 12B


